		The bill also makes other changes, including the following:
		<ul> <li>replaces statutory references to marijuana and marihuana with cannabis,</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>requires the Bureau of Labor Statistics to regularly publish demographic data on cannabis business owners and employees,</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>establishes a trust fund to support various programs and services for individuals and businesses in communities impacted by the war on drugs,</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>imposes a 5% tax on cannabis products and requires revenues to be deposited into the trust fund,</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>makes Small Business Administration loans and services available to entities that are</li> </ul>
		cannabis-related legitimate businesses or service providers,
		<ul> <li>prohibits the denial of federal public benefits to a person on the basis of certain cannabis-</li> </ul>
		related conduct or convictions,
		<ul> <li>prohibits the denial of benefits and protections under immigration laws on the basis of a</li> </ul>
		cannabis-related event (e.g., conduct or a conviction),
		establishes a process to expunge convictions and conduct sentencing review hearings
		related to federal cannabis offenses, and



		<ul> <li>directs the Government Accountability Office to study the societal impact of cannabis legalization.</li> </ul>

If the Senate swings Democrat once the vote is made it is likely it will make a big impact on this.
