The foundation through the West Ada School District will be raising funds and have a link on their website for our K9 Project.</li> <li>The coalition, foundation and West Ada school district will be continuing their collaboration and efforts in raising these funds.</li> <li>There have been some changes to the original deadline for this project and the Lieutenant in charge of the K9 unit will work with the coalition on dates for this project. Meridian Technical Charter then took that drawing and created it in digital format (see attached). - Legislation: the session has closed and no bill regarding hemp research and development passed. HB122 passed through the House. The Senate then worked with Law Enforcement, The Prosecuting Attorney's Association and the Mayor's office to create sideboards and make amendments and passed the bill. Once it went back to the House, Representative Moon then pulled her sponsorship due to the changes, so the bill died. She said she was disappointed that law enforcement interests "continue to blur" the difference between hemp and marijuana. (Idaho Press) This was a great session to bring awareness and education to our leaders and elected officials about cannabis policy. HB300 was introduced late in the session discussing the transportation of hemp through the state. It did not pass.
