Have seen an increase in the following: Drinking more alcohol Home and do not have to drive. Elderly and retirees – since they are isolated. Increase in cannabis use because of the close proximity to Oregon. Increase in cannabis use because citizens are working from home and not held accountable by others. Mental Health issues have increased. Fear of getting sick, getting others sick and financial loss. Have seen increased suicide rates, depression and anxiety. Adjustment disorder, lack of school and socialization. Children suffering from lack of socialization. Social Anxiety Disorder, fear of leaving the home and increasing panic attacks. Effecting substance abuse patients, have had patients admit to drinking while participating in virtual meeting support group (AA). Encourage those to seek out a counselor if needed at https://www.psychologytoday.com/us , you can search by zip code. Limit exposure to the news, continue to exercise, pay attention to things that are in your control and not to things that are out of control.
