4:12	Kendall Nagy, MADC Director Updates:	<ul> <li>SRO Update: <u>"Triple C"</u> cold medication (Dextromethorphan) was distributed by a student who admitted stealing it from a store. Two students consumed 6 to7 pills and had to be taken to the ER. Four other students also consumed the pills who were given to them by a different student. At another school a student consumed 7 <u>Daytrana</u> patches within 2 hrs. and had to be taken to the hospital. This is a schedule II prescribed patch that is a stimulant for ADHD. The third example of youth medicine abuse in the schools this week was the trading of <u>Quetiapine</u> for a pack of cigarettes. The student who consumed the 400mg antipsychotic medication was taken to the hospital for showing signs of extreme drowsiness.</li> <li>Monte: On jury duty with Meridian Elementary School teacher. The teacher shared with Monte that kids are sharing their ADD medicine. 30% of students are on these medications, when roughly only 10% need it.</li> <li>Kriste- There are non-stimulant medications to treat ADD/ADHD.</li> </ul>
	Hailey Arnold's Youth Sector Rep. Update	<ul> <li>Betnany: We have seen several patients come in with marijuana laced with LSD. It is with adults but it could trickle down to youth.</li> <li>Youth recruitment for 2018/19 update from Hailey: There are a couple youth liaisons (YL) so far. The goal is to have at least one at each high school, to provide feedback on MADC's efforts along with providing information to the schools. Hailey has reached out to a youth that attended the Unplug and Be Outside event. The two other targeted schools are Meridian High School and Renaissance.</li> <li>Earl has offered to look into YL representative from Renaissance.</li> <li>Kendall will also reach out to the Meridian High School Student Council.</li> <li>Hailey's goal is to build packets of information geared towards youth. This packet would also have information about volunteer hours.</li> </ul>
	Action Plan	<ul> <li>New MADC Strategies: Action Plan Development. The CEC is going through these five strategies in depth. To update you here is a little review: <ol> <li>Provide annual training for West Ada admin and teachers prior to school year beginning</li> <li>Train MADC member to present middle school drug prevention presentations- will need full school year commitment.</li> <li>Youth Treatment Scholarship Program: Dawn will send an email to the drug prevention</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
