#### **General Meeting 4:05:**

- 1. Welcome / Introduction: Cheryl Mulvihill
- 2. Approval of Minutes: Stephany Galbreaith
  - a. Motion by Jeanne Buschine, Second by Steve Botsford, All Approved
- 3. Coalition Trivia Question: What is the name of the National Campaign we would like to incorporate into MADC's prevention efforts?
  - a. Answer: <u>Natural High Campaign</u>= positive spin on healthy alternatives for teens to partake in other than drugs... ie sports, music, reading

  - I. Event was on September 15<sup>th</sup> @ 8am
  - II. Roughly 50 community members attended our Recovery Day Breakfast
  - III. Jason Coombs from Renaissance Ranch was the guest speaker for this event

  - I. Roughly 2,000 community members attended this event. We had fun educating the community on current drug trends with interactive games and an information booth.

- 7. SRO Update: Sergeant Harper via email
  - a. "It appears that things have been rather quit for the most part in regards to Drugs and Alcohol. The SRO's have had about 6 marijuana related incidents at school and 1 alcohol related incident. Outside of school juveniles are still being contacted regularly and cited/petitioned for alcohol offenses, marijuana, and tobacco. No other significant drug offenses (i.e. Cocaine, meth, heroin etc.)."
- 8. SRO Update: Officer Ellis and Officer Rhoades
  - I. <u>Dabbing=more concentrated Marijuana</u>. Taking the oils of marijuana and cooking it down to an almost candy state. The process is very dangerous i.e. causes fires and explosions. An individual smokes the more concentrated marijuana like crack, and is very addicting; Dabbing causes respiratory failure. <u>Erowid.com</u> is a great resource for drug information from a user's standpoint.

  - a. Logo has been updated

  - c. This trailer is taken to many community outreach events and displayed via photos

  - a. Overview: Criteria has been set up for dental work... essay and interview process. Once all denture work is complete for the individual they may be provided job training if deemed necessary by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Glance Selection Committee. Dental work will be donated by dentists, however there are other costs. Roughly \$1,200 per person for this program. Selected patients will be responsible for securing funding for the procedures. MADC may help them find sponsorship but will not provide actual funding. Dr. Grant works with the patients to build a situational plan and see what is needed for their specific case.
  - b. We will help partner the community member with the doctor, however will not be funding them through the program.
  - c. The first patient for this program finished last week with a financial sponsor Jason Coombs
